

Check & Connect Mentor Training is a 2-day competencybased training designed to provide participants with information, competencies, and skills needed to be an effective **Check & Connect mentor** at their local site.

Participants in this training will learn and understand —

- The core components and elements of Check & Connect
- The role and expectations of the Check & Connect mentor
- The population of students they are mentoring and how to best meet their needs
- How to implement the "Check" and "Connect" procedures with fidelity
- The competencies and skills needed to be an effective mentor, including, but not limited to: building relationships with students, families, and school personnel; using data to determine interventions; reflective listening; problem-solving; and engaging with families.

About Check & Connect

Check & Connect is an intervention designed to enhance student engagement at school and with learning for marginalized, disengaged students in grades K-12, through relationship building, problem solving and capacity building, and persistence. Who should attend



Participants receive a copy of the 2012 edition of the Check & Connect implementation manual. This manual builds on the experience and continuing research of the past 21 years to offer users an expanded guide that incor-

porates new findings about the model. It walks users through the Check & Connect implementation process, outlining the key components, describing the steps to implementation, and presenting the underlying theory and research, including the four types of student engagement (academic, behavioral, cognitive, and affective), and the importance of intervening both directly with students and indirectly through enhancing students' home and school contexts. Additionally, the 2012 manual provides guidance on options for implementing Check & Connect with fidelity to its principles and strategies, while also responding to local school and community contexts.
